THIS FORM MUST BE COMPLETED AND RETURNED TO CHANGE YOUR STATUS BACK TO A COMMERCIAL DRIVER Include a copy of your Medical Examiner's Certification (MEC), if applicable.

**This form serves two purposes:** allows commercial drivers to (1) self-certify and (2) submit a Medical Examiner's Certificate (MEC), if required for their type of operation.

All commercial driver license (CDL) holders must determine the type of business they operate in and certify to that type of commercial operation in order to maintain their CDL.

Based on the type of commercial operation selected, you may be required to submit a copy of your MEC to the Montana Motor Vehicle Division (MVD).

I certify my commercial driving is (check only **one** of the following two options):

- Interstate Non-Excepted: Operates in interstate commerce and meets the qualification requirements under 49 CFR part 391.
  You must submit a valid Medical Examiner's Certificate (MEC). In addition, prior to the expiration of your current MEC, you must renew your MEC and submit a copy to the MVD.
- ☐ Montana-Only (Intrastate) Non-Excepted: Operates in only Intrastate commerce and meets either the qualification requirements under 49 CFR part 391 or state qualification requirements.
  - You must submit a valid Medical Examiner's Certificate (MEC) or Montana Medical Certificate. In addition, prior to the expiration of your current MEC, you must renew your MEC and submit a copy to the MVD.
- ☐ Interstate Excepted: Operates in interstate commerce but engages exclusively in transportation or operation excepted under 49 CFR § 390.3(f), 391.2, 391.68, or 398.3.
  - Submission of Medical Examiner's Certificate (MEC) is not required.
- □ **Intrastate Excepted:** Operates in intrastate commerce but engages exclusively in transportation or operation excepted under 49 CFR § 390.3(f), 391.2, 391.68, or 398.3.
  - Submission of Medical Examiner's Certificate (MEC) is not required.

Important: If you checked the box for Interstate Non-Excepted or Montana Only Non-Excepted, you must submit a copy of your Medical Examiner's Certificate (MEC) and any accompanying waivers or variances along with this self-certification. If you are a non-excepted driver, it is illegal to drive a commercial motor vehicle in Montana without a valid MEC, and failure to keep your medical certification status information current with the state may result in the downgrade of your interstate CDL to a base, Class D license.

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## **Exception Checklist:**

Compliant with Montana law, you operate in excepted interstate or intrastate commerce when you drive a commercial motor vehicle (CMV) in interstate or intrastate commerce only for the following excepted activities (check all that apply):

As federal, state, or local government employees
To transport human corpses or sick or injured persons
Fire truck or rescue vehicle drivers during emergencies and other related activities
Primarily in the transportation of propane winter heating fuel when responding to an emergency condition requiring immediate response, such as damage to a propane gas system after a storm or flooding In response to a pipeline emergency condition requiring immediate response, such as a pipeline leak or rupture
In custom harvesting on a farm or to transport farm machinery and supplies used in custom harvesting operation to and from a farm, or to transport custom harvested crops to storage or market Beekeeper in the seasonal transportation of bees
As a private motor carrier of passengers for non-business purposes

If you checked one or more of the above activities as the only operation in which you drive, you operate in excepted interstate or intrastate commerce and do not need a federal Medical Examiner's Certificate (MEC).

If you did not check any of the above activities, you operate in non-excepted interstate or non-excepted intrastate commerce and are required to carry and provide a copy of a current MEC (§ 49 CFR 391.45), commonly referred to as a medical certificate or DOT card, to the MT Motor Vehicle Division. Most CDL holders who drive CMVs in interstate or intrastate commerce are non-excepted interstate or non-excepted intrastate commerce drivers.

If you operate in both the excepted interstate commerce and non-excepted commerce or both excepted intrastate commerce and non-excepted intrastate commerce, you must choose non-excepted interstate or non-excepted intrastate commerce to be qualified to operate in both types of interstate or intrastate commerce.
